### We will be learning all about 'Transportation'

To begin our learning, we will talk about road safety, we will go to the car park to look at signs and the zebra crossing. Outside the children will play 'stop' and 'go' games using traffic lights. The children will learn about how police help us and will make their own police badges.

Next, the children will learn about fire engines and how they help us. What is on the fire engine that helps fire fighters put out fires. The children will take part in target shooting games outside with water. They will do observational drawings of fire engines and make shape fire engines. We will also practise our fire drills.

Moving on we will learn all about construction vehicles. We will make movable diggers using split pins. Outside the children will take part in heavy work - moving large materials - digging sand and mixing. The children will try to follow picture instructions to build with construction materials.

At the end of the month, we will celebrate Chinese New Year. The year of the snake. We will make snake craft and try food from Chinese culture. We will make art to music, painting using oriental colours. The children will listen to Chinese music and do a dragon dance outside. Throughout the half term we will look at books about people who help us.

#### Late Collections

#### Headlice

Can I please ask that you check your child's hair regularly for headlice and treat appropriately if needed, this may mean treating your child's hair more than once to ensure that treatment has been successful. Please see the link below for useful information.

#### Illness

Please only send your child to playgroup if they are well enough. Children should not be attending playgroup if they need Calpol before- unless this is for a specific reason such as immunisations.

# Warm clothing

With the weather turning colder. Children should attend playgroup with a warm coat and other warm items such as a hat and gloves. A reminder that children will get messy and they will get wet, so please ensure children have spare clothes to change into if needed.

# Playgroup Gates

Please ensure our playgroup gates are <u>only</u> opened and closed by adults. Please also ensure the gate is shut and bolted securely to safeguard children.
